Gail's kit will include one 500 yard spool of King Tut thread, pre-marked top fabric and backing fabric (~ 44 x 55), fusible batting (~ 45 x 60) and one titanium top stitch needle sized to the thread. Gail's workshop costs \$30 plus the kit fee of \$30, for a total of \$60.

Please see Kate and Kerry in the hallway to sign up for these activities. Also feel free to contact us if there are any classes you'd like us to offer. The Workshop Committee exists to meet your needs and we do follow up on your suggestions.
