Reports

Barbara Lazier, President

Indian Summer is a wonderful time of the year. We know that the cold weather will soon be upon us but we revel in those few stolen days of Fall when the sun shines, the temperature allows us to go outside without a coat and the wind swirls the leaves into beautiful piles.

Recently I have been working on my Sandy Lindal Tumbling Block quilt that we started last year in her workshop. I am really happy with the internal blocks and now am ready to tackle the outer border. Although the pattern called for an all dark border I wanted to do something different. What to do? I made a mock-up of 5 different blocks. Placing each beside the main blocks, I took pictures and closely scrutinized them to see which was most pleasing to the eye. Yesterday, while sipping my tea, I looked to the leaves and voila my decision was made clear. Mother Nature had done it again. My answer was right in front of me all of the time, I only needed to pay attention to her.

How do you make your niggly quilt decisions? Do you pick out fabrics before you begin a new quilt and stay the course? Do you fly by the seat of your pants and choose fabrics as you need them? Or do you begin

with a basic palette but are willing to add a zinger or change your fabric choices if the need arises. Whatever your approach, I am continually amazed by the variety and quality of beautiful quilts that we are treated to at each Show and Tell.

Ellen Collington Lecture and Workshop- Funding History

Ellen Collington was a long time active member of the Hamilton Quilters Guild serving many positions on the executive, including three years as president. She was a believer in lifetime learning and took many workshops at HQG and surrounding guilds in Canada and USA. She invested in fabric purchases for current and future projects. As a curator of her own fabric collection she amassed considerable inventory. Unfortunately one day she had a massive stroke and died. Some of her friends then measured, wrapped and priced her legacy of fabric and sold it.

The Collington family donated the profits from these fabric sales toward a lecture and workshops by a well-known Canadian quilter. Karen Laposa, Barbara Mahaffy and Catherine Schuler took on the project of bringing this idea to fruition. In the spirit of Ellen's lifetime learning philosophy we arranged for Laurie Swim from Nova Scotia to come to Hamilton in April 2017. Ms. Swim will give a lecture on Thursday April 27 with seating for 200. This will be held at Church of Annunciation of Our Lord, 280 Limeridge Road W, Hamilton.

On Friday April 28 and Saturday April 29 she will be conducting workshops for twenty quilters each day. These will be partially subsidized for members of the Hamilton Quilters Guild members. Friday's workshop is "A Tree for All Seasons". Saturday's workshop is "Picture It In Fabric". Workshops will be held at First Unitarian Church, 170 Dundurn St, Hamilton. Tickets for these events will go on sale at the guild's January 2017 meeting.
